Susan Wood, PhD, Keynote Speaker



Susan Wood is an Associate Professor of Health Policy and Management at the George Washington University Milken Institute School of Public Health, and Director of the Jacobs Institute of Women's Health Services where her work and public advocacy focuses on women's health and the use of scientific knowledge in public policy. She previously was Assistant Commissioner for Women's Health at the FDA, and directed the FDA Office of Women's Health from 2000-2005. Prior to her time at FDA, Dr. Wood was Director of Policy and Program Development at the US Dept of Health and Human Services' Office on Women's Health.

From 1990-1995, Dr. Wood worked on Capitol Hill as professional staff for the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues initially as Science Advisor and later as Deputy Director to the Caucus, Dr. Wood helped develop and promote the Women's Health Equity Act, and was directly involved with many policy initiatives and legislative proposals which would advance biomedical research, women's health, family planning, and health care reform.

Cecile Richards, President of Planned Parenthood



As president of Planned Parenthood Federation of America and Planned Parenthood Action Fund, Ms. Richards leads a movement that has worked for nearly 100 years to build a healthier and safer world for women and teens. Since joining Planned Parenthood in 2006, Ms. Richards has expanded its advocacy for access to health care and ensured that Planned Parenthood played a pivotal role in shaping health care coverage and services for women under the Affordable Care Act. In 2011, she led an unprecedented nationwide campaign to preserve access to Planned Parenthood preventive care through federal programs. Before joining Planned Parenthood, Ms. Richards served as deputy chief of staff for House Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi. In 2004, she founded and served as

president of America Votes, a coalition of 42 national grassroots organizations working to maximize registration, education, and voter participation.

Tamika Auguste, MD

Doctor Auguste is Associate Professor and serves as director of simulation education at the MedStar Washington Hospital Center. She is also a member of the ACOG Simulation Consortium.

Nancy D. Gaba, MD

Nancy Gaba received her MD degree from The George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences, where she also completed her residency. She has been the Residency Program Director, and served as the Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education and DIO from 2007-2014. She has also been the Division Director for General Obstetrics and Gynecology and Vice Chair of the Department. Dr. Gaba became the Oscar I. and Mildred S. Dodek and Joan B. and Oscar I. Dodek Jr. Professor and Chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at GW in March 2014. Her national roles include ABOG oral examiner, faculty on the CREOG School for Program Directors, faculty in the APGO Surgical Education Scholars Program, as well as service on numerous other national committees.

Kevin Grigsby, DSW

R. Kevin Grigsby, MSW, DSW is Senior Director, Member Organizational Development at the Association of American Medical Colleges. Dr. Grigsby is focused on organizational development in the academic health enterprise. He facilitates developing a future-oriented perspective in academic leaders and the aligning organizational resources with missions. Dr. Grigsby remains active in promoting effective interpersonal communication within academic health centers and in implementing alternative conflict resolution/management strategies at the department and institutional levels. He has been instrumental in developing career development programs for interim leaders, aspiring leaders, associate deans, and department chairs.

Atul Grover, MD, PhD

In his role as executive vice president, Atul Grover, M.D., Ph.D., provides strategic leadership in the areas of medical education, academic affairs, health care affairs, scientific affairs, learning and leadership programming, diversity and inclusion, public policy, and communications. Dr. Grover joined the AAMC as associate director for the Center for Workforce Studies in 2005, where he managed research activity and directed externally funded workforce studies. He became a director of government relations and health care affairs in 2007, and served as the association's chief public policy officer from 2011-2016. Previously, Dr. Grover held positions in health care finance and applied economics consulting as well as in the U.S. Public Health Service, Health Resources and Service Administration National Center for Health Workforce Analysis.

Matt Hopkins, MD

Matt Hopkins, MD is currently an Assistant Professor of OB/GYN at the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine in Rochester, Minnesota. Currently, he is Assistant Professor in OB/GYN Mayo College of Medicine - Rochester, MN and Vice Chair for Education Department of OB/GYN and Associate Program Director OB/GYN residency Mayo Clinic College of Medicine.

Diane Horvath-Cosper, MD, MPH

Diane Horvath-Cosper, MD, MPH, FACOG earned her undergraduate degrees from the Ohio State University, her master of public health at Johns Hopkins, and her medical degree from the Medical University of Ohio. She completed her residency in OB/GYN at the University of Minnesota, then practiced as a generalist OB/GYN for four years at a teaching hospital in St. Paul, Minnesota. She returned to fellowship at Washington Hospital Center in DC in order to focus her practice on family planning and advocacy, and will complete her training in June 2016.

Alison Jacoby, MD

Alison Jacoby is a Professor in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at UCSF. She is the Interim Chief of the Gynecology Division and the Director of the UCSF Comprehensive Fibroid Center.

Todd Jenkins, MD

Dr. Todd Jenkins is the Director of the Division of Women's Reproductive Healthcare at the University of Alabama-Birmingham (UAB). He has worked as an academic general OB/GYN on the faculty of the University of California-Irvine and Carolinas Medical Center in Charlotte, NC. Dr. Jenkins holds a master's degree in healthcare administration with a focus in leadership and operations. He is an Associate Editor of the American Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology (AJOG) and serves as an Examiner for the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Previously, he served as a member of ACOG Gynecology Practice Bulletins Committee as well as an AAGL Curriculum Committee. As part of his training, he completed a AAGL Fellowship trained in Minimally Invasive Gynecologic Surgery.

Jani Jensen, MD

Dr. Jani Jensen is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin medical school and is board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology and Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility. She is an Assistant Professor in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, where she is also the Director of the Assisted Reproductive Technologies Program as well as the Third Year OB/GYN Clerkship Director.

Tiffany McNair, MD, MPH

Combining her dual areas of expertise, she is a practicing obstetrician-gynecologist and preventive medicine physician in the Greater Baltimore area, while also applying skills in public health and policy analysis at local, state, and federal health agencies. She is part of President Obama's Commission on White House Fellowships class of 2014-2015. This unique opportunity to work within our nation's government is designed to encourage active citizenship and a lifelong commitment to service. He has served in the Dean's office in the roles of Assistant and Associate Dean for Diversity and Medical Education, and has authored a chapter on Cultural Competency for the AHME Guide to Teaching Hospitals.

Laurie Swaim, MD

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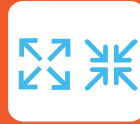
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
